Multi-Purpose Community Facilities Program

A Capital Projects Fund Program

Overview

The U.S. Department of Treasury awarded \$279 million to Pennsylvania for critical capital projects. In June 2022, the Pennsylvania General Assembly appropriated this funding to the <u>Pennsylvania Broadband Development Authority</u> (PBDA), which is using the funds to establish grant programs that identify eligible projects that meet program guidelines and federal requirements.

The <u>CPF-Multi-Purpose Community Facilities</u> <u>Program (Facilities)</u> is one of the three funding programs created by PBDA to help deploy these funds in communities across Pennsylvania.



Who Can Apply

- Community Anchor Institutions (CAIs) include, but are not limited to schools, libraries, recreation centers, community health centers, and non-profit organizations.
- Municipalities and Local Government Institutions

Eligible Projects

Projects must be construction or improvements to full-service community buildings, structures, and public spaces that directly enable work, education, and health monitoring. The physical structure must be available year-round to the public.

Funding

Facilities will award \$45 million in competitive grants. Individual grants will be between \$250,000 and \$2 million. Matching funds are not required. For reimbursement, project costs must be incurred within the timeframe in the grant agreement.
