## Broadband Infrastructure Program Update

### 53 Infrastructure Projects - \$204,168,889.00


- 34 projects in active construction phase
- 19 projects in pre-construction phase (Permitting, Design, Etc.)
- All projects have finalized contracts

#### Reimbursement

- 6 of 12 subgrantees successfully submitted invoices
- \$7.1M in reimbursements processed (March 2025 Sept 2025)

#### **Commercial Service Available**

- 13 projects nearing or can currently provide commercial service to some portion of the project area
- ~13,000 BIP locations now served by FCC definition



## Multi-Purpose Community Facilities Program Update

## **49 Projects Across 27 Counties - \$44,706,223.69 (***as of October 9, 2025*)

- 23 projects in active construction phase
- 24 projects in pre-construction phase
  - 4 project in pre-construction/post-bidding phase
  - 4 projects in bidding phase
  - 14 projects in pre-bidding phase (Design, Review, Etc.)
  - 2 projects in pre-acquisition phase
- 2 projects complete

#### Reimbursement

- 28 subrecipients have submitted first invoice
- \$6.84M reimbursements processed (February 2025 October 8, 2025)
  - ~15% of awarded amount
- August and September 2025 reimbursements were below initial estimates

# V. Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program

## **BEAD** Update

#### Final Proposal submitted to NTIA – Sept 4th

- 107 projects provisionally selected from 21 applicants
- \$790M in BEAD funds
- Approx. 130,000 total locations to achieve universal access

#### **NTIA Review and Curing**

- Curing is ongoing and has included:
  - Administrative changes to location data
  - Further negotiating and justifying project costs
  - Working collaboratively with NTIA to ensure alignment with federal guidance and all program requirements
