## Frequently Asked Questions

### Program Next Steps

**What are the next steps in the Program now that the Final Proposal has been approved?**

**What is the deadline for completing projects funded through BEAD?**

Projects funded through BEAD must be completed and the initiation of service undertaken within four years of the date of a fully executed BEAD agreement and receipt of the grant award.

### Eligibility

**Can PBDA confirm what type of pre-award expenses are approved for the BEAD Program?**

Any pre-award expenses are incurred at the provisionally approved BEAD Grantee's own risk. Any pre-awarded expenses must be identified in the project budget, and such expenses shall be subject to approval by PBDA and NTIA.

**What are the prevailing wage rate requirements for BEAD?**

BEAD projects must adhere to Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage (PW) laws. The PA Dept. of Labor and Industry (L&I) is the agency that makes all prevailing wage determinations, including prevailing wage rates and rate classifications. **How can grantees obtain Pennsylvania Prevailing Wage Rates?**

Grantees can obtain prevailing wage rates pertinent to their project using the following methods.

1. Following the traditional process of requesting wage rates via the [Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry website](#).

**What does PBDA consider "long-term" as it relates to Long-Term Fiber Lease?**

A long-term fiber lease is a minimum of 10 years.

**Does the Build America, Buy America Act apply to BEAD?**

Yes. Grantees must comply with all applicable federal laws through the BEAD grant process.

### Program Specific

#### What is low-cost service option (LCSO)?

BEAD grant recipients must offer at least one low-cost broadband service option (LCSO) for eligible subscribers, with the LCSO set by the BEAD grant recipient. The LCSO must offer speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps and latency performance of no more than 100 milliseconds. The BEAD grant recipient must offer the LCSO throughout the 10-year federal period of interest, or in the case of a LEO, the 10-year period of performance. Each applicant for BEAD grants must propose its LCSO as part of the application. If an applicant for BEAD grants seeks flexibility to change the LCSO rate over time, then it must state in its application the methodology that it will use to change the LCSO in the future.
